In a world filled with different religions and countless interpretations of the Bible, determining fact from opinion can be overwhelming. One person says their understanding of the Bible is true, while others claim they know the real truth. With so many different perspectives, how can anyone be certain of what is truly factual?

My goal with this writing is to address these questions, and many more, drawing upon more than thirty years of my personal research. What you will not find in this book is the promotion of any particular religion, church or affiliation. Nor will you be asked to buy anything or donate any money. This book was created to make understanding the Bible easier, not for financial gain.

To keep things simple, I have chosen to present this information in a narrative form rather than relying solely on facts and data. This approach aims to be engaging and relatable, making the reading easier to understand.

I will construct a timeline that pieces together elements from the past, present, and future to create a comprehensive picture. This should make studying the Bible more manageable and help answer previously challenging questions.

My objective is to provide readers with the tools needed to think independently and verify the truth for themselves. These tools will help avoid the pitfalls of mistranslations and individual biases, including my own.

Do I expect everyone to accept my words as absolute truth? Certainly not. Instead, I hope that readers will investigate my research and arrive at their own conclusions, ultimately bringing them closer to God.

How to Get the Most Out of This Book: Using Simple Tools to Discover the Truth

For those beginning their journey into Bible study, the easiest starting point for verifying where to find information in Scripture, is the internet. While not always entirely reliable, it can be a helpful resource. If I quote a Scripture without providing its chapter or verse, you can easily search online to confirm where it is written.

Please keep in mind, if you use the internet to do your research and it doesn't align with the manuscripts known as God's word, it is simply not true. No matter how many times you find the same information online – making it look like the truth – it is always best to check with what God says in the Bible and ancient manuscripts, rather than believing something other than God's word.

The same holds true for anything any man, including myself, may say or write. If it doesn't agree with what God says in the Bible and ancient manuscripts, it should not be believed.

To help you know what aligns with God's word, I will introduce tools that can assist you in uncovering the truth.

The first step in researching the truth is to understand how to trace words in the Bible back to their original languages, which would be Hebrew, Greek, and Aramaic. These three languages are considered foundational, and symbolize perfection, completeness, and divine wholeness.

Speaking these languages is not necessary to do research. One can simply verify the meanings of specific words by referencing the original texts. I will be providing a straightforward tool to help with this process.

Uncovering the true facts involves thorough investigation. This means looking into seven areas: archaeology, astronomy, geography, history, science, technology, and religion. I refer to these seven areas of study as my "research tools." The number seven in Biblical numerics stands for spiritual completeness.

Combining the three languages and these research tools gives everyone ten methods to use to discover the truth. The number ten in Biblical numerics signifies divine law, righteousness, responsibility, perfection, judgment, and completeness.

In order to get to the true meaning of what is written in the Bible, a person should research not only the original languages, but also consult one, or several, or all of the ten methods suggested here to find the truth.

Suggested Study Tools

For those seeking a deeper understanding of the Bible, I highly recommend the Authorized King James Bible. An even more comprehensive option is The Companion Bible, which includes the Authorized King James text along with side columns, indexes, and detailed explanations.

The importance of the Authorized King James Bible is because it is compatible with the Strong's Concordance. This concordance allows you to trace any word in the Bible back to its original Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic roots using a unique numbering system. By doing so, you can uncover accurate meanings that give you a better understanding of the Scriptures.

Why is precise interpretation important? Consider this example: the Bible instructs you to "honor your father and mother," yet Jesus is also quoted as saying that you must "hate your father and mother" to follow Him. This appears contradictory, until you examine the original meaning. Using the Strong's Concordance, you'll find that the word "hate" in this context means "love less." Thus, the passage conveys that Jesus is asking you to prioritize your love for Him above all else, including your parents. Proper translations resolve these apparent contradictions and prevent misunderstandings that can cause significant confusion or harm.

In addition to the tools I mentioned, I also recommend the Smith's Bible Dictionary. This dictionary provides more than just definitions of Biblical terms. It gives details about the Bible's history, the setting where the verse took place, the geography of the region at the time, the personality of the characters, and the doctrines that apply. It gives the background information necessary for a well-rounded understanding of life during Biblical times.

While more advanced tools are available for scholars, the ones listed here are needed to uncover the truth within Scripture.

Are the Bible study tools I just mentioned perfect? Not at all. Anything translated by man is subject to misinterpretation and mistranslation. However, the more a person studies Scripture, the better equipped they become to know what is accurate and what is not.

By using the recommended study tools to study the Bible, it will become easier to know and find the truth. That way you don't need to rely on what others say. You will have the tools to study more accurately and learn the truth for yourself.

For those seeking to grow in their knowledge of the Bible, I recommend studying with a church or group that teaches by reading Scripture chapter by chapter, verse by verse. It is important to understand who is speaking, to whom they are speaking, and the language being used.

Recognizing whether Scripture is written in the common language of the time or contains metaphors, idioms, parables, or symbolism is vital. Understanding these distinctions brings clarity to the text.

Additionally, learning to identify the subject, object, and article in each verse helps reveal the true meaning. Most importantly, whoever you choose to study with should teach in the same way as the churches of Smyrna and Philadelphia did in Biblical times.

If you take Bible study seriously and use the right tools, you will learn more and feel more confident. You'll also gain a clearer understanding of what is true.

Questions to Think About

- Have you ever come across Bible Scriptures that left you feeling confused? Would it help to have some of the answers, or better yet, learn how to find those answers yourself?
- Have you ever wondered if there are discrepancies in the Scriptures?
- Were you taught that the mark of the beast is a physical mark on the forehead or a computer chip in the hand?
- Have you heard that Eve ate an apple in the Garden of Eden?
- Were you told that Jesus was born on December 25th and crucified on a Friday?
- Have you been taught that people could burn in hell forever?
- As a parent, have you ever responded to your child's Bible questions with, "We're not supposed to know everything," even though Jesus said, "Behold, I have foretold you all things"? Would you find it helpful to work with your child to provide them with tools to seek out answers together?

These questions, and many more, will be discussed in the following pages. So, join me on a journey through the Bible, from the beginning to the end, the Alpha and the Omega.

CHAPTER 1

The Timeline

Before God created the Heavens and the Earth, wisdom was with Him.

The Bible begins with, "In the beginning, God created the Heaven and the Earth," but it does not specify when this occurred. To uncover the timeline, we must utilize all available study tools and conduct deep research.

Approximately 4.6 billion years ago, God formed our sun and planet.

At the same time, around 4.6 billion years ago, God created an asteroid that could influence our future. Modern scientists have named this 1,000-foot-wide (305-meter-wide) asteroid after the Egyptian god of chaos and destruction, "Apophis." If you search for Apophis online, you'll find it's a real asteroid currently under study by NASA.

Around 4.5 billion years ago, God sent water to our planet, sourced from what many call space and what Biblical scholars refer to as the firmament.

About 200 million years ago, the landmasses of Earth were united as one supercontinent, now known as Pangaea.

During this time, for His pleasure and companionship, God created all the souls at the same time, and put them in the form of what God called angels.

Among these angels was a special one, full of wisdom and beauty, named Lucifer. God was particularly pleased with him.

The angels were all male, appearing to be around 32 years old in human terms. They were large, majestic beings with perfect recall, capable of constructing marvels far beyond our current comprehension. Living without pain, injury, death, or sorrow, it was an era of unparalleled beauty and joy. The angels could move freely between Heaven and Earth, bridging the divine and the material worlds.

At that time, the Earth was perfectly aligned on its true axis, with no jet streams or storms to disrupt its harmony. The entire planet was exceptionally beautiful. Surrounding the Earth was a protective firmament, which gently cast dew each morning to nourish and enrich the planet's growth.

Unimaginable structures were built using advanced technology far beyond what exists today. Massive boulders, weighing over 200 tons, were effortlessly moved and precisely aligned with the stars, showcasing incredible accuracy. These structures, including the pyramids, were constructed across the globe, forming a natural electrical grid that powered ancient times.

Cities were even built underground. These newly discovered subterranean metropolises continue to baffle modern scientists and engineers, as their construction demonstrates a level of precision and ingenuity that defies current understanding.

Some scholars say that the pets of that era were companions of the angels. Fossils of these ancient creatures, reconstructed in modern times, have been named dinosaurs.

As Lucifer's influence grew, so did his power. When angels approached God with requests, His wisdom often led Him to decline their requests, knowing what was best. In such cases, the angels turned to Lucifer, who was eager to grant their desires, using this as a means to gain followers and expand his influence.

Over time, unrest spread among the angels. Some desired greater power and control. Lucifer, entrusted with the sacred duty of guarding God's Mercy Seat, held a position of the highest honor. The Mercy Seat required protection because the angels, gifted with free will, posed a potential threat to the divine order if they strayed from righteousness.

As evil and unrest continued to spread, approximately 66 million years ago, God sent an asteroid to end the age of the dinosaurs. This cataclysmic event, now known to scientists as the Chicxulub impact, disrupted the Earth's axis, creating jet streams, storms, and earthquakes that reshaped the planet.

The asteroid event marked the beginning of the breakup of the supercontinent known as Pangaea. Magma surged through the Earth's crust, creating a volcanic rift zone. As Pangaea fragmented, volcanic eruptions scattered ash and debris across the land, shaping the continents we recognize today.

Approximately 2.4 million years ago, under the influence of Lucifer and the continual battles that took place between the angels that followed Satan and the angels that followed God, God initiated the ice ages, which persisted until about 14,500 years ago.

During that time, Lucifer's ego grew so large that he no longer wanted to guard the Mercy Seat. He wanted to sit on it and be in charge. His rebellion against God earned him the name Satan, meaning tempter, accuser, punisher and adversary.

Over time, Satan acquired numerous names, each symbolizing his fall from grace. As students study his history, they should not let these degrading titles cause confusion. Despite his rebellion, Satan remains as he was originally created, wise and beautiful. His actual appearance did not and will not change. Satan is still beautiful in appearance.

On the topic of appearances, consider this: if I claimed that Satan had horns, most people would accept it. However, if I said Jesus had horns, many people would reject the notion. The misunderstanding stems from interpreting "horns" literally. In the original languages, "horns" symbolize power. Thus, Jesus possesses horns (power) for good, while Satan possesses horns (power) for evil. These are not physical horns but representations of authority and influence.

CHAPTER 2

During this period of upheaval, certain individuals resisted Satan. These warriors were known as the Elect and the Zadok. Meanwhile, other angels chose neutrality. Unmoved by the conflict between God and Satan, those angels focused on their own affairs and left others to contend with the battle.

As Satan's influence expanded, so did his arrogance. His following grew until he commanded a third of the angels.

At this pivotal moment, God intervened. He could have either destroyed a third of His disobedient children or rebuilt everything from the ground up, giving each of His children the freedom to choose between following Him or following Satan.

Approximately 14,000 years ago, due to Satan's evil and his influence over a third of God's children, a catastrophic event occurred. It was a worldwide flood that left the Earth desolate. This event, often referred to by some scholars as the great Katabole, marked the time when Satan was cast down from his position of power.

It was at this time that God removed all the angels from Earth, taking them back to Heaven. He wiped out every remnant of life. This worldwide flood destroyed every tree, plant, and creature. The cities were broken down and the whole land became desolate. In His fierce anger, the Earth mourned, and the heavens turned black. The Earth was left formless and void, a testament to the devastation caused by Satan's rebellion.

It is important to note that this event was not Noah's flood. This was a global destruction that predated Noah by thousands of years.

Around 13,000 years ago, the first period of Earth's history ended, and a new one began. These periods of time are known as the Earth Ages. The first Heaven and Earth Age had concluded, ushering in the second, in which we currently live. A third Heaven and Earth Age is yet to come. While the Earth itself remains the same, these Ages are distinct dispensations of time, each with its unique purpose and character.

The Second Earth Age began with Genesis 1:2 in the Bible. As it is written, "a thousand years to man is as one day to the Lord." Based on this perspective, the first five days of the Second Earth Age, equivalent to five thousand human years, were a time of divine restoration. During this period, God rebuilt the planet, making it habitable once more. He created animals for hunting and aquatic creatures for fishing, preparing the Earth for what He would ultimately call "man."

On the sixth day, God created all of mankind, which included all races, also known as Gentiles. Pay close attention to the word "created" as it appears in this Scripture. God created man in His own image and in the image of the angels. To enable them to multiply, He also created female, or woman.

God would then place a soul waiting in Heaven into each female embryo at the moment of conception. As the human child developed and grew, it passed through the water of the woman to be born innocent, with no memory of the First Earth Age. With a fresh start and free will, the child could choose for themselves whether to follow God or Satan.

Since a soul originally belonging to an angel is now housed in a human body, born through the water of the woman, Jesus explained this process when He said, "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." This is commonly referred to as being "born again," or more accurately, "born from above."

When God created all the races on the sixth day, did He instruct them to "be fruitful, multiply, and plenish the Earth"? While "plenish" is an old term that might have seemed appropriate, God did not use it. Nor did He say "populate the Earth," though that would also have been accurate.

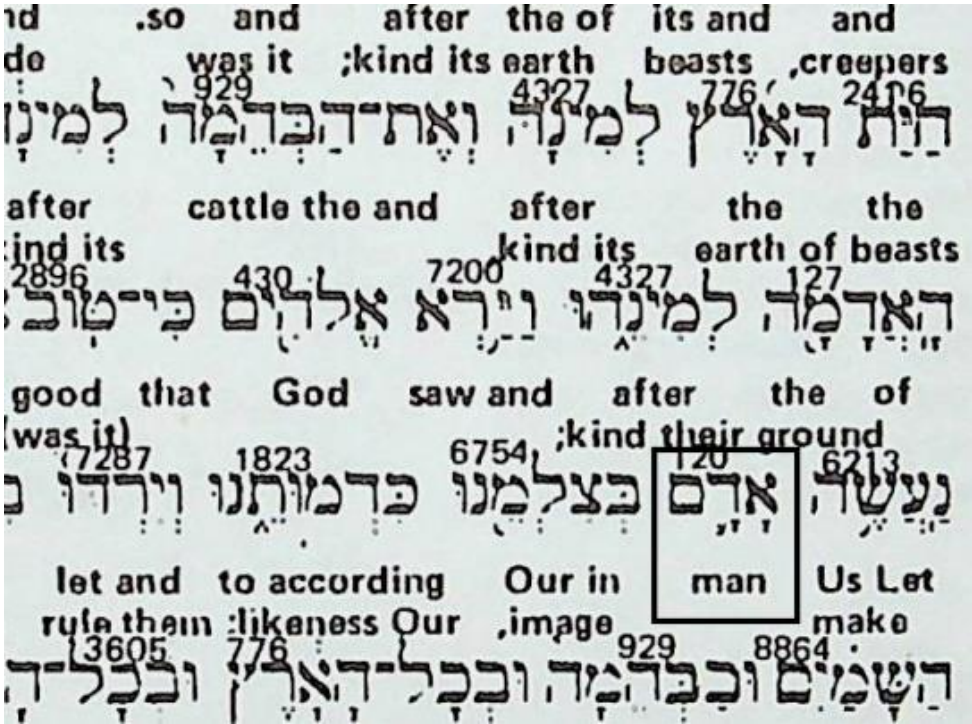
Instead, God specifically said, "Be fruitful, multiply, and replenish the Earth."

The choice of the word "replenish" is significant, as it implies the Earth had been previously inhabited, then destroyed, and now required restoration.

The timeline is filled with details here. Before creating Adam, God first created animals for hunting and fish for fishing. To confirm the name "Adam," we turn to the Hebrew manuscripts, which are written from right to left.

The following diagrams are from a more advanced study tool called The Green's Interlinear four volume Old and New Testament. This interlinear Bible is especially useful for pastors, Biblical scholars, and serious students of Scripture who want to engage directly with the Biblical languages. It allows for a detailed examination of the text without requiring extensive knowledge of Hebrew or Greek.

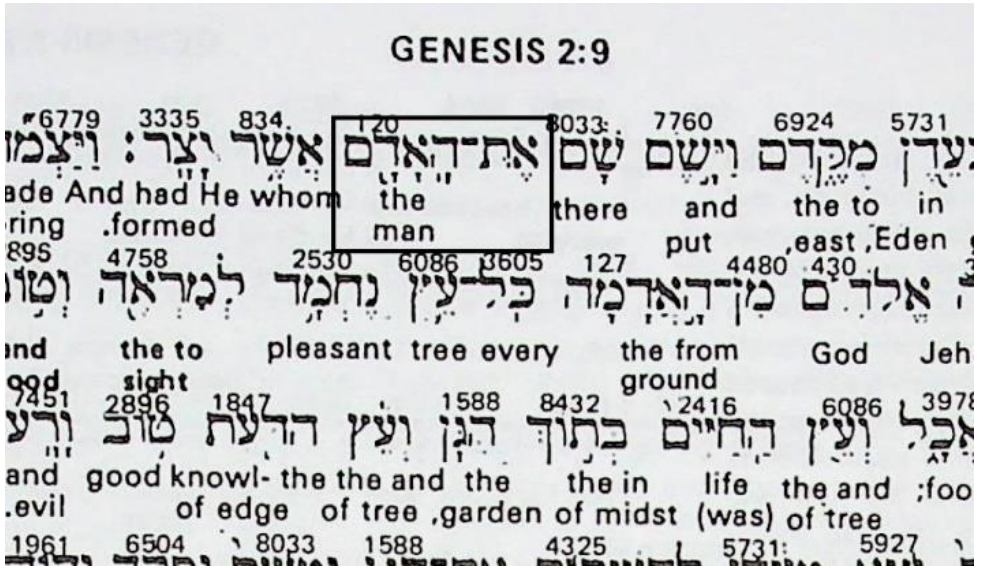
In the first diagram, the Hebrew word above "man" translates to "Adam," referring to mankind, known as all races being created on the sixth day.



During this time, there was no death, which explains why the individuals mentioned in the early parts of the Bible are described as having such long lives. Additionally, there were no acts of killing.

On the seventh day, God rested, deeply pleased with all His work.

On the eighth day, God wanted someone to cultivate the ground, so He "formed" a unique man named Eth-Ha' Adam, or simply Adam. To understand this name more deeply, let's examine the Hebrew manuscripts in the second diagram.



Notice how in this black box it says "THE MAN." The Hebrew text spells out "Eth-Ha Adam," which refers to a completely different Adam than the one mentioned on the sixth day.

To clarify, the "sixth-day man" refers to mankind as a whole, encompassing all races. In contrast, the Adam of the eighth day, often referred to as "the man," signifies the beginning of a specific lineage, one that ultimately leads to Jesus Christ.

From the DNA (helix curve) of "Eth-Ha Adam," God formed a unique woman named Eve. Of course, the concept and terminology of DNA and the helix curve was unknown at the time. When the original manuscripts referred to a "curve," translators, unfamiliar with the scientific terminology, wrote it as God taking Adam's rib. This interpretation has persisted through the ages.

God then created a special place called the Garden of Eden, designed exclusively for Adam, Eve, and their descendants. This garden was a secluded area, separate from the races created on the sixth day.

It is written that Eve is the "mother of all living." But how could Eve be the mother of all the races created on the sixth day? This phrase is often misunderstood. It does not imply biological motherhood of all races but carries a deeper, more specific meaning.

Through Eve, passing from umbilical cord to umbilical cord, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ would come. All who believe in Jesus will have eternal life. This promise extends to everyone, including those from the diverse races created on the sixth day. Salvation through Jesus transcends race and origin.

Eve, as the first woman in the lineage of Christ, earned the title "mother of all living." Had the world understood that God created all races on the sixth day and declared His creation "good," racial injustice might never have taken root. Yet, ignorance of this truth has fueled inequality and prejudice throughout history.

The Biblical timeline reveals two distinct acts of creation. On the sixth day, God "created" hunters and fishers. On the eighth day, He "formed" the first farmers. Following this, God created animals for agriculture, and Adam, formed on the eighth day, named them.

If God "created" all the races on the sixth day, why did He need to "form" a couple on the eighth day? God had a special plan for the couple he formed on the eighth day. That special couple was to be the beginning of the lineage of Jesus Christ.

However, Satan sought to disrupt this divine plan. As a cunning and strategic adversary, he understood that undermining God's work required attacks from both the heavens and the earth. His ultimate goal was to derail the lineage of Christ.

To achieve this, Satan needed followers to influence and corrupt. Through deception, they infiltrated institutions, schools, families, governments, churches, and even Biblical scholars. One of his most destructive tactics was altering the words of Scripture, leading to mistranslations and distortions in different versions of the Bible. Soon, I will go deeper into how Satan orchestrated these attacks from both the ground and the sky.

CHAPTER 3

Knowing Satan's intentions, God issued the first commandment in the Garden of Eden: "But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die."

The tree in the midst of the garden was known as the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, and it symbolically referred to Satan.

Throughout the Bible, trees were used as symbols, just as the serpent was used as symbolism for Satan in the Book of Genesis. The Bible is filled with symbolic elements. Taking these symbolic elements literally often leads to mistranslations, confusion, improper teachings, and false religions.

Satan, being cunning, devised a plan to disrupt and attempt to stop the seed line of Jesus Christ. According to the Bible, he "beguiled" Eve as part of this attack.

In the original language, the word "beguiled" implies that Satan "wholly seduced" Eve. In other words, Satan had sexual relations with her. This is why God declared:

"I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."

To clarify, let's rewrite this passage with the definitions derived from the original language:

I (God) will put enmity (hatred and division) between thee (Satan) and the woman (Eve), and between thy (Satan's) seed (offspring, progeny, or descendants) and her seed (the seed passed to Eve through Adam); it (Jesus) shall bruise thy (Satan's) head (a future prophecy), and thou (Satan) shalt bruise his (Jesus's) heel (fulfilled when Jesus was crucified, and a spike was driven through His heel).

For further clarity:

God will place hatred and division between Satan and Eve, and between Satan's offspring and Adam and Eve's descendants. Through Adam and Eve will come Jesus, who will bruise Satan's head. In turn, Satan will bruise Jesus's heel, as fulfilled during the crucifixion when a spike was driven through His heel.

When Satan beguiled Eve, he became the father of Cain. This is supported by six Scriptures that validate Satan's paternity of Cain. One of these references is the verse cited above, spoken directly by God.

It's worth noting that many struggle with the idea of Satan having sexual relations with Eve, yet readily accept the notion of a talking serpent and the myth of Eve biting into an apple, despite the fact that the Book of Genesis never mentions an apple.

Keep in mind, a male child was included in Biblical genealogies only if he had offspring (descendants/children). Knowledgeable scholars generally agree on this. Despite Cain having descendants, in the Book of Genesis, he is notably absent from Adam's genealogy.

Abel is also missing from Adam's genealogy, but for a different reason. Abel had no descendants, because he was murdered by his brother Cain. Seth was the first child of Adam and Eve to have offspring, making him the first to appear in Adam's genealogy as the pure bloodline leading to Jesus Christ.

Now let's think about what Jesus said when teaching a lesson about good versus evil. Jesus told us to learn the Parable of the Fig Tree. He talked about good figs and bad figs, and about wheat and tares. Jesus said the wheat represented God's children, and the tares represented the children of the devil.

The more an individual studies, the more evident it becomes that Eve had sexual relations with Satan first, which fathered what the parable called the tares. After that, Eve had sexual relations with Adam, which fathered what the parable called the wheat. As a result, Satan was the father of Cain, while Adam was the father of Abel.

In addition, Cain's genealogy is listed first, while Adam's genealogy is listed second, in the Book of Genesis. Cain's descendants were called Kenites, a term in the original languages meaning "offspring of Cain."

If Jesus told us to learn about the good figs and bad figs, and about the wheat and tares, wouldn't it make sense for the Bible to show the family trees (the bloodline) of both groups? Common sense tells us that the wheat came from Adam's family line through Seth, and the tares came from Cain's family line through Satan.

If some people still want to believe Cain was Adam's son, they have free will to think as they want. As always, I recommend using the research tools recommended earlier to find the true answer.

In summarizing the events of the Garden of Eden, the birth of Cain and Abel reveals specific details. Eve gave birth to Cain and then "continued" to give birth to Abel, as correctly translated. This indicates that Cain and Abel were fraternal twins, specifically a rare case of heteropaternal superfecundation, where two eggs are fertilized by sperm from two different fathers.

The true events of the Garden of Eden have often been described by scholars as too complex to teach, especially to young children. To simplify matters, traditions created the well-known but inaccurate story of Eve eating an apple. Unfortunately, many still believe this oversimplified narrative.

Consider Adam's statement about Eve: "She gave me of the tree, and I did eat." This phrase has been the subject of scholarly debate.

One interpretation suggests that Satan deceived Adam into believing he was a woman, leading Adam to engage in sexual relations with him.

Another interpretation suggests that Adam engaged in homosexual intercourse with Satan, which would have been an abomination to God.

Another perspective says Adam simply touched Satan, thereby violating God's law. The interpretation one chooses ultimately depends on individual study and reflection. Due to the complexity of these interpretations, the more familiar story of Adam partaking in the forbidden fruit, commonly represented as an apple, was adopted for easier teaching.

It is crucial to approach traditional stories with discernment, as they can sometimes be misleading. Always conduct thorough research, using reliable tools and resources, when confronted with potentially deceptive accounts.

The story of Adam and Eve's transgression, eating from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, which symbolized Satan, represents the first recorded sin in the Old Testament. Their act violated God's first commandment.

Notably, when Adam and Eve became aware of their sin, they covered themselves with fig leaves. Consider the symbolism: if the sin had been the simple act of eating an apple, they might have covered their mouths. Instead, they covered their genital areas, suggesting that their sin was of a sexual nature.

As a result of this sin, death was introduced to humanity. The Bible records that early human lifespans extended for hundreds of years, but over time, these spans shortened, eventually stabilizing at 40, 70, or 120 years per generation.

CHAPTER 4

Satan's primary mission was to disrupt the bloodline of Jesus Christ. Following the sin in the Garden of Eden, he succeeded in his first attempt by producing Cain, who later murdered his brother Abel. Abel would have been a direct bloodline descendant of Christ, but Satan's interference was aimed at stopping God's plan.

Cain's story raises further questions. After committing murder, Cain departed to the land of Nod and took a wife. But whom did he marry? It is unlikely to have been a sister, as Adam and Eve had no other children at the time. The land of Nod, where Cain settled, was named and populated by those created on the sixth day. Individuals from the sixth day had already moved into and inhabited that region long before Cain's arrival.

Cain settled in the land of Nod and took a wife from among the women created during the sixth day of creation. Many people are unaware that women existed before Eve, as they were part of the beings made on the sixth day.

Let's explore some key details about Cain. After Cain killed Abel, God punished him by declaring that he would no longer be able to cultivate the land. Cain was destined to live as a fugitive and a wanderer. This is why, according to some interpretations, Cain's descendants have been unable to farm independently and must rely on others to cultivate the land for them.

When Cain expressed that his punishment was too severe to bear, the Scripture is written, "And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold. And the LORD set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him."

Pause for a moment. If Cain was the only living child of Adam and Eve at the time, why would he fear being killed by others? And why would God warn that anyone who harmed Cain would suffer sevenfold vengeance?

The answer lies in the presence of the sixth day creation. Cain feared that, outside the protection of the Garden of Eden, these other beings might seek to harm him.

The more one studies, the more the Bible reveals its deeper meanings. For some, this exploration may shed light on long-standing questions, offering insights into topics such as the sixth day creation, Cain's exclusion from Adam's genealogy, the land of Nod, and the origins of Cain's wife and children.

Returning to a broader context, a third of the angels followed Satan during the First Earth Age. After Satan's rebellion, these angels returned to Heaven, awaiting their turn to be born of women. However, some grew impatient and desired to interact physically with women instead.

For those who find the idea of angels engaging with human women difficult to accept, consider this: the Bible states that God created man in His image and in the image of the angels. If humans, made in this image, possess physical forms and reproductive organs, and are without wings, it follows that angels, including Satan, share the same characteristics.

This perspective may provide new understanding to those seeking clarity on these ancient narratives.

Many people may not envision angels as they truly are, largely due to the widespread images of angels dressed in white gowns with wings. However, for those who believe in the written account that God created both man and angels in His image, it might be time to reconsider these traditional portrayals.

CHAPTER 5

So far, we've discussed how Satan launched attacks from the ground. Now, let's explore how he devised an aerial strategy to disrupt the lineage of Jesus Christ.

Satan's air-based attack involved a small group of angels who had followed him during the First Earth Age. Out of all the angels who rebelled against God, seven thousand disobeyed Him by refusing to be born of women. In open defiance, they crossed the firmament and engaged in relations with the women of that time. The offspring of these unions were giants, also known as the Nephilim.

These fallen angels assisted Satan in corrupting the seed line of Christ by impregnating the descendants of Eve. Their goal was to render these women unfit to carry the lineage of Jesus Christ.

When the fallen angels were on Earth, ancient texts outside of the Bible document that people worshiped them as gods. Additionally, God told Noah to take seven of every clean animal and two of every unclean animal. Why seven of each clean animal? Soon after the ark landed, Scripture mentions Gentiles. How could Gentiles exist if only eight Adamic souls were on the ark? This raises two possibilities: either the flood of Noah was not worldwide, as the flood in the First Earth Age had been, or Gentiles were also aboard the ark. If the flood was not worldwide, this could also explain how all races and the Kenites survived.

After the flood, when God spoke to Noah and his sons, He said, "Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the Earth." This marked the second time in Scripture that God commanded humanity to replenish the Earth after a great devastation.

Since Noah's time, there have been approximately 36 generations, assuming a generation spans 120 years. If only eight Adamic souls were aboard the ark, how could all the diverse races have emerged from them within just 36 generations?

For those who believe this is possible, consider this. Even if there were 1,000 generations between Noah's flood and today, the way God designed our human bodies makes it genetically, mathematically, and physically impossible for all the races to have descended naturally from just eight Adamic souls.

Here's another perspective to think about. If only eight souls survived the flood, and if Noah's flood was global and Adam and Eve were the first humans, then where did the Gentiles come from?

If everyone descended from Adam, Eve, and Noah's family, then everyone would belong to the same race, and Gentiles wouldn't exist. Clearly, traditional interpretations of these events don't add up.

When children ask these questions, many parents respond with, "We're not supposed to know everything." But with access to extensive study tools, it's time to move past such answers and provide our children with the thoughtful, well-researched explanations they deserve.

Looking back through history, it becomes evident that God is patient and intentional. Everything He does unfolds strategically over time. This is why He created all the races on the sixth day of the Second Earth Age, declaring His creation "very good."

While some scholars may disagree with the idea that the races were created on the sixth day, careful research into ancient texts supports this truth. When God creates something, He does so with specific intent and purpose, just as rocks can't fly because that isn't their purpose. Similarly, the way God designed our physical bodies makes it genetically impossible for all races to originate from a single couple.

CHAPTER 6

Throughout history, Satan and human traditions have sought to interfere with God's plan, including attempts to disrupt the lineage of Jesus Christ. The Kenites, for instance, have played a significant role in these efforts.

In the Book of Revelation, we read about seven churches that Jesus judged, but only two were without fault: Smyrna and Philadelphia. If you're searching for a church, consider seeking one that aligns with the teachings of these two churches.

With deeper study, one may discover that those referred to as belonging to the "synagogue of Satan" are the Kenites. Who are the Kenites? They are the descendants of Cain. And who is Cain? He is the son of Satan. Smyrna and Philadelphia were distinguished because they taught about the Kenites, a truth that many churches today neither understand nor teach.

Throughout Scripture, the Bible provides guidance on what to seek and what to avoid in walking with Christ. It offers examples of individuals who made righteous choices in following Him, as well as those who failed. By following the lessons and examples provided in Scripture, a person can live a more fulfilling and loving life that draws them closer to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

For example, the Book of Luke offers insight into the timing of Jesus' birth. Luke recounts the story of Zachariah, a Levitical priest, and his wife Elizabeth. Zachariah served the course of Abijah, which fell between June 13th and June 19th. After completing his service, Zachariah likely arrived home between June 22nd to 24th. As was customary, he would have undergone a cleansing ritual, meaning he likely did not lay with his wife until June 23rd to June 25th. This marks the approximate conception date of John the Baptist.

By knowing John's conception date and recognizing that he was six months older than Jesus, we can determine that Jesus was conceived on approximately December 25th. This calculation suggests that Jesus was born during the Feast of Tabernacles, around September 29th.

Scripture further supports this timeline. On the day Mary learned of her pregnancy, she immediately traveled to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Upon Mary's arrival, John the Baptist leaped in Elizabeth's womb, recognizing the presence of the Holy Spirit within Mary.

Reflecting on this subject, consider this: when John the Baptist, at just six months in Elizabeth's womb, leaped at the presence of the Holy Spirit in Mary's womb, what does this suggest about the beginning of life?

As previously noted, Satan persistently attempts to disrupt God's plan, particularly concerning Jesus. One such interference occurred through a pagan ritual involving Claus. I encourage you to explore the origins of this by searching, "How did the pagan ritual of Santa Claus begin?"

Satan's followers fabricated a tale of a heavysset man with a white beard and red attire, bestowing gifts upon children. Over time, this story evolved into the figure of Santa Claus, serving as a distraction from the significance of the day Jesus was conceived.

Christians are called to honor Christmas as the sacred day commemorating the conception of Jesus Christ. It is vital to teach the true essence of this celebration and remain vigilant against distractions. While Santa Claus may seem like a harmless tradition for children, perpetuating this myth promotes falsehood and inadvertently glorifies Satan. By doing so, one violates the Ninth Commandment: "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour." Simply put, we are commanded not to lie.

Consider the prophecy found in Psalm 22, written a thousand years before the birth of Christ. This Scripture vividly describes the final days of Jesus before His crucifixion, affirming His authenticity. No other religious figure or deity has a prophecy written one thousand years before their life that accurately foretells their end, except for Jesus Christ.

Furthermore, a thousand years before Christ's birth, the Jewish people were instructed to place the blood of a lamb above their doorways. This act shielded their firstborn from the angel of death during the original Passover. This momentous event established the Passover tradition.

Isn't it remarkable that Jesus was crucified during this same Jewish holiday, Passover, a thousand years later? Early scholars hesitated to refer to Jesus as our Passover, concerned it might offend the Jewish community. In the original manuscripts, the term used is "Pascha" or "Paschal," derived from the Hebrew word "Pasach," meaning "to pass over."

The alignment of these events is not a coincidence, but a testament to the divine orchestration of history, underscoring the profound connection between the Old and New Testaments. This affirmed Jesus Christ as the fulfillment of God's promises.

This is where Satan's Kenites took advantage by manipulating a pagan ritual called Ishtar, or Eatar, to rename that day Easter. This pagan practice was associated with fertility rituals and orgies involving symbols like bunnies and eggs. Don't just take my word for it, look it up for yourself. Search for "how did the pagan ritual of Ishtar start?" The term "Easter" even appeared in an earlier version of the King James Bible, but was later corrected.

Jesus became our Passover, and the time of His death and resurrection should be celebrated as a sacred occasion because He shed His blood to forgive our sins. Celebrate Passover as one of the holiest times of the year. Share its significance with others, but remain vigilant against Satan's distractions. While the Easter bunny might seem harmless and just for children, it perpetuates another lie, glorifying Satan and violating the Ninth Commandment. As the Bible states, "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour," which, in plain terms, means we should not lie.

Isn't it ironic? Parents teach their children not to lie, yet they perpetuate a falsehood by glorifying Satan through these traditions. Children grow up thinking lying is acceptable because their parents did it. Isn't it time we stop glorifying Satan and start honoring our Heavenly Father by embracing and telling the truth?

For those wondering which day of the week Jesus was crucified, an in-depth study of Hebrew traditions reveals it was a Wednesday, before sundown. Here's how the timeline unfolds:

- Wednesday sundown to Thursday sundown was day one.
- Thursday sundown to Friday sundown was day two.
- Friday sundown to Saturday sundown was day three.

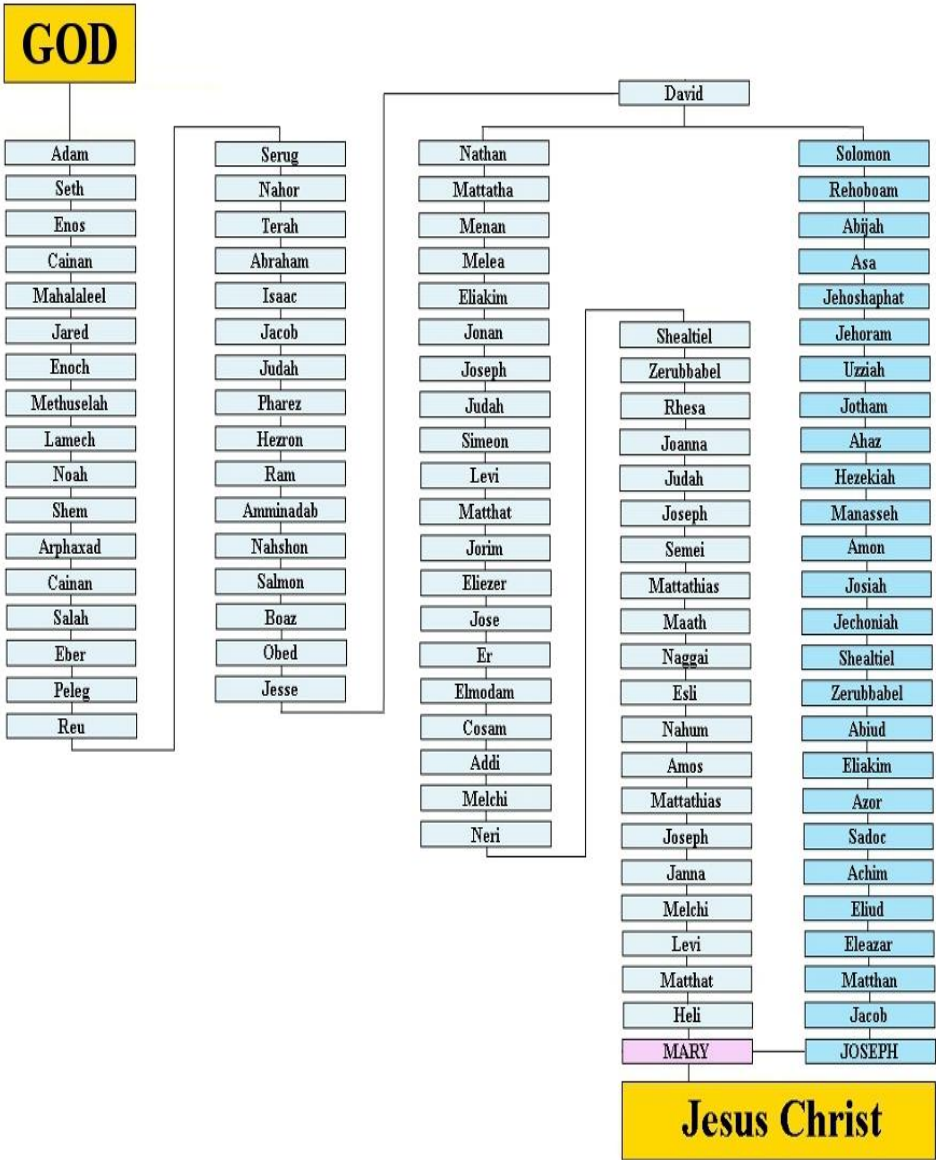
Jesus rose from the dead early Sunday morning. The tradition of saying Jesus was crucified on a Friday is merely a man-made tradition and a false teaching.

Another frequently asked question is, "What is the unforgivable sin?" According to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the unforgivable sin occurs when God's Elect or Zadok refuse to let the Holy Spirit speak through them against Satan, when he returns. As of now, since Satan has not returned, it is impossible to commit the unforgivable sin.

CHAPTER 7

Two critical teachings in the Bible can guide believers to overcome the end-time deception when Satan returns: the Key of David and the Parable of the Fig Tree. These teachings hold profound insights for those walking with Jesus and seeking truth in the face of deception.

To understand the Key of David is to grasp the true lineage of Jesus Christ. The following diagram illustrating His lineage. While many may have read these names before, they may not have seen them presented in this way.



As you know, keys have notches that allow them to unlock doors. Using this symbolism, let's revisit the Key of David. Each "notch" on this key represents profound teachings and truths meant to draw people closer to Jesus Christ. Here are the notches:

1. Share the Key of David and the love of Jesus Christ, along with His lineage, with everyone.
2. Avoid seeking guidance from evil spirits, as Saul did.
3. Christians should not fight against other Christians.
4. Steer clear of presumptuous behavior.
5. Trust God to choose whom He wills, while you focus instead on your own actions.
6. Jesus is the many-membered body, the temple, and the house for all believers.
7. Do not judge based on a single perspective.

Now, turning to the Parable of the Fig Tree, here's a short poem to help remember its key lessons:

There's a parable in Matthew, Mark, and Luke.
A fig tree faced Jesus and heard His rebuke.
It's a lesson teaching a season given to you.
Use caution during those five months of time.
Stray from false prophets and look for the sign.
Stay the course in believing and don't get mad.
Simply know who are the good figs and the bad.

Jesus didn't tell us to simply know about the Parable of the Fig Tree, He instructed us to learn it! Learning this parable means understanding its connection to the season of end-time prophecy. This is when Satan will return, pretending to be Christ, followed by the true return of Jesus.

In the Bible, we are taught about the 7 seals, 7 trumpets, and 7 vials.

Currently, we are living in the time of the 5th trumpet and the 5th seal. This is a critical period for teaching and learning.

To clarify:

- **Seals** represent wisdom, placed in your mind.
- **Trumpets** signify actions and the timing of events.
- **Vials** represent the wrath of God poured out upon humanity.

May we continue to seek wisdom and walk in faith during these times.

Do not be ignorant like the heathens. Understand that at the 6th seal, the 6th trumpet, and the 6th vial, Satan will return. Satan comes first, and Christ will not return until the 7th seal, the 7th trumpet, and the 7th vial.

CHAPTER 8

Before we explore what to watch for regarding Satan's return, let's address a false doctrine that has spread through many Christian churches.

In the eighteen thirties, a woman named Margaret MacDonald had a troubling dream. By her own admission, she believed the dream to be evil. However, two preachers heard about it and saw it as an opportunity. They thought, "We can profit from this idea. People will embrace it because it offers an easy escape."

These preachers selectively quoted single verses of Scripture, ignoring the context and surrounding passages. They interpreted symbolic language literally, crafting their own teaching. This doctrine, known as the "fly away doctrine," has since spread widely and is considered one of Satan's most powerful deceptions. It suggests that when Satan arrives, he will masquerade as Jesus, claiming to take believers away into the air. Many will follow him, mistaking him for Jesus Christ.

God foresaw the rise of this deception. This is why He declared in Ezekiel 13:20 (Authorized King James Version): "Wherefore thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, I am against your pillows, wherewith ye there hunt the souls to make them fly, and I will tear them from your arms, and will let the souls go, even the souls that ye hunt to make them fly."

In the coming sections, we will go deeper into the timing of this so-called rapture and its connection to Satan's return. However, before proceeding, let's address a frequently asked question:

Is hell real? The Bible describes hell in four distinct ways:

1. A place for those who sleep – When the flesh body dies, it returns to dust, never to rise again.
2. A sepulcher – The grave where bodies are laid to rest and decay.
3. Gehenna – Referred to by Jesus as a burning garbage pit, symbolizing destruction.
4. The abode of fallen angels – A place where the rebellious angels are confined.

Each description offers insight into the nature of hell and reinforces the need for vigilance against deception. More will be revealed as we continue this exploration.

To answer the question, yes, hell is real in the sense described above, but it should not be confused with the Lake of Fire. The Lake of Fire will only come into existence after God's judgment. For those who do not make it to Heaven, God's consuming fire will cause them to cease to exist, and their names will be blotted out of the Book of Life.

Here's an analogy from Scripture about the Lake of Fire. It is compared to the fat of a lamb dripping onto a fire. When the fat falls into the flames, it burns and turns into smoke that rises forever. However, this does not mean people burn forever. The phrase "burning forever and ever" is a Hebrew idiom, meaning they are completely and permanently destroyed. As it is written, they are turned to ashes from within. No one would remember or mourn them, so there would be no sorrow in eternity.

To clarify further, consider this analogy: if you light a cigarette and let it burn, it turns to ashes. Are those ashes permanent? Yes. Can you reassemble them to form the cigarette again and keep burning? No. The destruction is final.

So why do some churches continue to teach that people will burn forever? Simply put, it's often used as a fear tactic to maintain control over congregations. Some churches imply that unless you give money and follow their teachings, you will face eternal torment. In my opinion, a congregation should be united by the truth of God's word, not by fear or misinterpretations of Hebrew idioms.

Let's apply some common sense here. You live as a human for a finite number of years. If you make mistakes and fail to repent, does it make sense that you would suffer eternal torment? Is that the nature of a loving God? This false teaching about burning forever has turned countless people away from Christianity.

Another question often arises: does the Lake of Fire exist now? As it is written, to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord. The Lake of Fire will only exist after God's judgment. Currently, there is a gulf (or chasm) in paradise separating those who have reached Heaven by believing in Jesus and repenting, from those who have not.

In the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, it is written that the rich man could see Lazarus in the bosom of Abraham but could not cross over to join him. For those on the wrong side of the gulf, existence feels like wandering through an endless maze. Being in angelic bodies, they cannot die, yet they remain thirsty with nothing to drink and hungry with nothing to eat. No amount of suffering, prayer, or wealth can free them from this place.

It is important to clarify that this should not be confused with the man-made doctrine of purgatory. According to some interpretations, purgatory is a place where souls who die in God's grace but are not fully purified are cleansed of their imperfections to achieve the holiness required to enter Heaven.

Others claim that purgatory involves pain or discomfort and that the prayers of the living can aid in their release. However, this is a man-made teaching not found in the original Biblical manuscripts. Historically, the doctrine of purgatory was promoted to encourage financial donations to the church, with the promise that such contributions could help loved ones transition out of purgatory. Scholars who adhere to the true word of God often view this doctrine as sacrilegious.

Ultimately, those on the wrong side of the gulf must remain there until the millennium, where they will have the opportunity to learn about love, discipline, and Jesus Christ.

What is the millennium, and when does it begin? The millennium is a period of one thousand human years, or one day in the Lord's time, and it begins with the return of Jesus Christ.

CHAPTER 9

Suggestions to Prepare for End-Time Prophecies

When I refer to "end times," I don't mean the end of the world, but rather the end of life as we currently know it. It will be a period of significant and transformative change. Below are five practical suggestions to help you prepare for these potential shifts. What you choose to do with these suggestions is entirely up to you.

Maintain at least a five-month supply of food and rotate it regularly to keep it fresh. This precaution is not only wise for end-time scenarios but also for unforeseen emergencies, such as natural disasters or economic disruptions.

Whenever possible, pay your bills five months ahead. This practice creates a financial buffer, offering peace of mind and stability in case of unexpected challenges.

3. **Secure Gold and Silver for Bartering**

If you're able, keep a small reserve of gold and silver. These can serve as valuable assets for trade during uncertain times, particularly if financial systems falter and traditional currency loses its value.

4. Exercise Caution with Claims of Divinity

Be skeptical of anyone who claims to be Jesus, God, a deity, or any supernatural being, while you remain in your current physical body. Such claims are likely false.

5. Stay Vigilant for Specific Signs

This point may not make sense now, but will become clear in time. If someone claims to be Jesus, God, or any deity and the Earth is not engulfed in flames, do not believe them.

CHAPTER 10

The Timeline for End Time Prophecy

It is written that the end will not come until all prophecies are fulfilled during the final generation of the fig tree.

In 1948, Israel became a nation, marking the beginning of the fig tree's planting. This event symbolizes the growth of both good figs and bad figs. Based on Biblical interpretations, a generation can span 40, 70, or 120 years, allowing us to estimate possible timelines for the end.

If this event signaled the final generation, then we can do some calculations. Adding 40 years to 1948 brings us to 1988, a time during which certain prophecies were fulfilled, though the end did not arrive. Extending the timeline by 70 years leads us to 2018, yet the end remained unrealized. We now find ourselves within the 120-year generation.

This suggests that as prophecies continue to unfold, the second coming draws nearer. However, this does not guarantee that the end will occur by 2068. Rather, it indicates that the culmination of events could happen at any point between now and then. All prophecies must reach fulfillment before the end can manifest.

Signs of the End Times

One of the events that will happen in the end times is the establishment of a one-world system. This system will encounter what is described as a deadly political wound, signifying a fracture when one government dissents and falls away. At this critical juncture, Satan will emerge to restore unity, reviving the one-world system.

A one-world common currency will also be introduced, meaning our current financial system will completely change.

As the end approaches, it is written that the Euphrates River will dry up, releasing four evil angels. The two witnesses will wield extraordinary power, bringing plagues that will make the plagues of Egypt seem mild by comparison. Those who follow Jesus have no reason to fear the two witnesses. However, woe to those who follow Satan, mistaking him for Jesus.

When Satan arrives, he will bring with him ten of his major lieutenants. At the same time, ten nations will unite against Israel, forming a coalition under Satan's command.

Contrary to what many think, Satan will not appear as an overtly evil entity. Instead, he will present himself in all his beauty and wisdom, preaching a counterfeit gospel. Remember, his ultimate goal is to deceive people into believing that he is Jesus.

Satan will possess the ability to speak all languages, and he will tailor his approach to each religious group, claiming to be their deity. He will offer wealth, gifts, and other temptations to lure people into allegiance. To accept his offerings is to choose to love and follow him.

Consider the following hypothetical example, which illustrates Satan's deceptive tactics. Pay close attention to how he can use Scripture cunningly, twisting it to sound as though he is Jesus. Notice how he manipulates even the words Jesus spoke to reinforce his deception.

For those who believe in the rapture theory, take this to heart. Ever since the great Katabole, when Satan was cast down from his position of power, he cannot rapture anyone. However, he has a plan to exploit this belief. Imagine his followers asking him:

"Father, we see what looks like an asteroid approaching from the sky. Should we be concerned?"

Satan will reply, "Fear not, my children. Have you not read? Is it not written that Satan will be cast from Heaven with his fallen angels? That is Satan coming. But you will be taken up in the clouds with me before he arrives."

In this scenario, people will follow Satan like sheep, believing he is Jesus. They will eagerly seek to be among the first to be "taken."

This deception will buy Satan more time, allowing his followers to bring others, including loved ones, friends, and acquaintances, to him, so they too may be "raptured."

It is written that Satan is death. And this is where prophecy will be fulfilled, where a mother will betray her daughter to death (meaning bring her to Satan), and a father will betray his son to death (meaning bring him to Satan) to be raptured by him.

As Satan's reign nears its end, he will defy God's command and kill the two witnesses in a public arena in Jerusalem. Their bodies will be left exposed, a display of Satan's supposed power. However, after three and a half days, the two witnesses will rise again.

The collision will hurl massive boulders and soot into the atmosphere, forming hailstones weighing between 120 to 180 pounds, which will decimate the armies at Hamongog, fulfilling additional prophecies.

The earth will burn, fulfilling yet another prophecy, as the rudiments, representing evil imperfections, are utterly destroyed. Thunder, lightning, and a massive earthquake will follow, one so unprecedented that it will eclipse anything humanity has ever experienced, fulfilling even more prophecies.

At this climactic moment, the true Jesus will return. All will be transformed into their spiritual bodies, and every knee will bow to Him in reverence, singing the Song of Moses, fulfilling further prophecies.

This is where many have misunderstood Paul's words, taking them literally. When Paul mentioned that we would meet Jesus in the clouds in the air, it's important to understand the context. Paul wrote in colloquial Greek, where "clouds" often symbolized large groups of people. This interpretation is consistent across his writings.

Additionally, when Paul referred to "air," he was speaking of the "Holy Ruach." The term "Ruach" translates to spirit, breath, or wind. Connecting these ideas, we understand that "clouds" represent a gathering of people and "air" signifies spiritual existence. As mentioned earlier, we will all (a vast group, or clouds) be in our spiritual bodies (air). However, people are free to interpret this differently. Everyone has the free will to believe as they choose, which also aligns with prophecy.

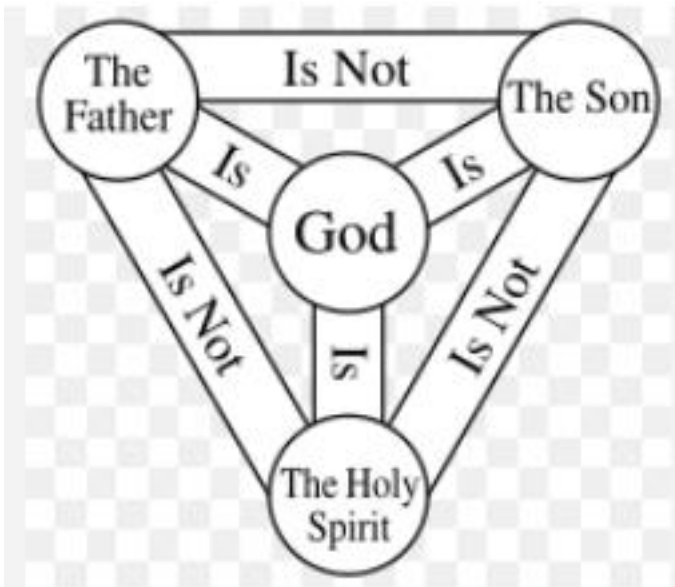

CHAPTER 12

The following sections will address some questions, presented in no particular order.

1. What is the Trinity?

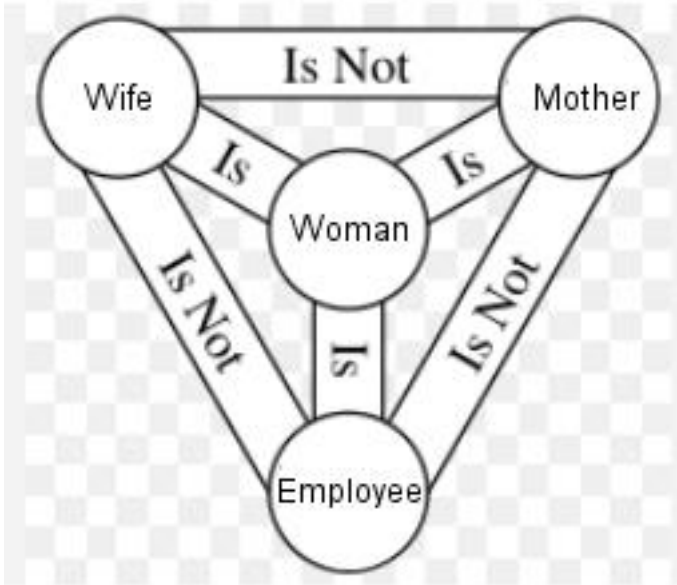
Refer to the diagram below for an explanation.



Simply put, God is the Father in His dimension, the Son in our dimension, and the Holy Spirit in both dimensions. However, the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is not the Father.

Understanding the Trinity – An Analogy

If this seems a bit confusing, I appreciate your patience as I explain with an analogy. The following diagram is designed to help those who may still feel unsure about the concept of the Trinity.



Imagine a woman who plays three roles: she is a wife, a mother, and an employee. Although she can fulfill all three roles, each one is distinct and serves a different purpose. Similarly, within the Trinity, God exists as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – each unique, yet one in essence.

2. How Should I Pray?

Think of God as the closest family member you could ever have. Simply talk to Him. Thank Him for His blessings, share your thoughts and feelings, and tell Him that you love Him. There's no need for formal or ritualized prayers – speak honestly from your heart.

If you need protection, ask for it. If you desire blessings, simply request them. Always remember to pray in the name of Jesus Christ, as this affirms your request. It is important to direct your prayers to God alone – not to Mary, angels, or anyone else – as this aligns with His will.

For a truly fulfilling life, consider praying something like this:

Father, I ask that everything I think, say, and do be according to Your will and not my own. I ask this in the precious name of Jesus Christ. Thank You, Father.

When you genuinely seek this, you may experience profound and positive changes in your daily life.

3. Should I be baptized? If I was baptized as a baby, is that good enough? If I should be baptized, how can I be baptized?

Jesus set an example for us to follow. Was He baptized? Yes, He was. Now, consider this. When the two criminals were crucified alongside Jesus, and He said to one of them, "Today you will be with me in paradise," did they pause the crucifixion, take the criminal down, walk him to the Jordan River to be baptized, and then put him back on the cross? Of course not.

So, is baptism a requirement to enter Heaven? If it were explicitly stated in John 3:16, I would say yes, but it isn't. Therefore, baptism is not a requirement for salvation. However, it is an important act of obedience to God, and as a follower of Christ, I choose to be obedient.

The purpose of baptism is to publicly declare your belief in Jesus Christ and acknowledge that He died on the cross for your sins. Baptism as an adult or at the "age of accountability" is considered a personal, meaningful decision. On the other hand, being baptized as a baby is often seen as a christening or dedication rather than a true baptism.

If you were only christened as an infant, it's recommended to be baptized again once you reach the age of accountability. That's when you can make the decision yourself, understanding the significance of your faith and baptism. This age varies for each person, but the key is that it should be a conscious, voluntary decision made by someone who believes in Jesus Christ and understands what baptism symbolizes.

How can you be baptized? Any Christian can baptize another Christian. After confirming your belief in Jesus Christ and your understanding that He died on the cross to forgive your sins, the baptism is performed. You are fully submerged in water and baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

4. I was baptized at the age of accountability, but I have backslid. Do I need to be baptized again?

No, you do not need to be baptized again. That would be like crucifying Jesus all over again. If you have sinned or drifted away from your faith, the solution is repentance. Confess your sins to God and renew your commitment to Him.

If you have been baptized more than once at the age of accountability, perhaps out of misunderstanding, simply repent for the repeated baptisms and move forward in your faith. Remember, God is gracious and forgiving. You don't need to be baptized again to restore your relationship with Him; repentance is what is needed.

5. Do I need to be baptized or belong to a church to take communion? How often can I take communion? Can I take communion from home? What do I need to take communion? What do I say if I'm taking it by myself?

There is nothing in Scripture that explicitly requires baptism or church membership to take communion.

In Biblical times, people typically took communion during three annual gatherings: Passover, Pentecost, and the Feast of Tabernacles. However, how often you take communion is a personal choice. I encourage you to focus on the meaning behind communion rather than letting it become a ritual.

Yes, you can take communion from home, even by yourself. For the elements, I suggest grape wine if you can consume it; otherwise, grape juice is a suitable alternative. You can purchase communion wafers online or at a Bible store.

When taking communion, here's what I do and say:

1. **Repentance:** I begin by repenting for my sins. None of us are perfect, but repentance prepares our hearts and souls to partake in this sacred act.
2. **Blessing the Elements:** I ask our Heavenly Father to bless the bread and wine (or juice) as symbols of the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I reflect on His sacrifice, which established the eternal covenant for the forgiveness of sins.
3. **Thanksgiving and Petition:** I thank God for His many blessings in my life. Then, I ask Him to grant me wisdom to live according to His will and to glorify His name.

Finally, I close with... Heavenly Father, I ask this in the precious name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

6. Is it true that once saved, always saved?

The idea of "once saved, always saved" is true in the sense that salvation is a gift of grace. However, it is possible to backslide. If you persist in sin without repentance, you risk losing your salvation.

If you have been saved and baptized, but you sin, repentance restores your relationship with God. But if you do not repent of your sins, you could lose your salvation.

And as mentioned earlier, for the Elect or Zadok, committing the unforgivable sin, such as blaspheming the Holy Spirit, would result in losing salvation, even if they were initially saved. Therefore, it's crucial to remain faithful, repentant and do not give in to Satan.

7. Can I anoint myself, my family, my house, or my pets?

Yes, you can. Begin by obtaining some extra virgin olive oil and a small vial. Pour a bit of the oil into the vial and ask God to bless it as anointing oil, praying in Jesus' precious name. Remember, it is not the oil that has the power to anoint, it is God who blesses and anoints. The oil serves as a symbol of obedience to His will.

If you wish to cleanse your home of an evil spirit, place a small dab of the oil on your doorway and say:

By the power of Jesus Christ, I command all evil spirits, including any that have entered with someone else, to leave my home immediately and return to where they came from.

Make sure to issue this command in the name of Jesus Christ and specify that the spirits must return to their original place, signifying their inevitable death.

8. Will I recognize my loved ones in Heaven?

Yes, you will. Scripture provides insight into this in passages like the following:

"And they shall come at no dead person to defile themselves: but for father, or for mother, or for son, or for daughter, for brother, or for sister that hath had no husband, they may defile themselves."

This verse speaks of the millennium, a time when teachers on Earth provide guidance to family members who were previously on the left-hand side of the gulf and are now being instructed. These individuals possess a spiritual body but retain a human soul, making them "unclean." Those with a human soul are still at risk of spiritual death if they do not believe in Jesus and repent of their sins by the end of the millennium.

When a teacher interacts with someone unclean, they become defiled and must cleanse themselves for seven days and change their garments before entering the temple to receive Jesus' teachings again. The mention of relatives in this context indicates that you will recognize your loved ones and have the opportunity to assist them.

Regarding the phrase "sister that hath had no husband," it implies that a family member could guide her. However, if the sister has a husband, her spiritual teaching would come from someone in her husband's family.

Why do you want to recognize your family members? The answer is simple – because you love them.

I ask this question for a reason. Consider the greatest amount of love you feel for someone you hope to be with in Heaven. Now imagine placing that love on a scale of one to one hundred. In Heaven, the love you hold so dearly on Earth would barely register as a one.

What does this mean? On that same scale, the love you will experience for everyone in Heaven will reach one hundred. When you let go of human limitations and embrace your spiritual nature, you'll begin to understand the overwhelming and all-encompassing love that awaits you in Heaven.

9. What is the mark of the beast?

The mark of the beast is not a physical symbol stamped on your forehead or hand. Even if someone were to write 666 on your forehead, it would hold no power if you truly believe in Jesus. Some mistakenly think the mark is a computer chip, but this misunderstanding stems from a lack of proper teaching.

The mark of the beast is within your forehead – representing your thoughts. When your mind aligns with actions that glorify Satan, you are already carrying the mark. Similarly, the mark in your hand symbolizes your deeds. If your daily actions reflect the work of Satan, you bear his mark through your behavior.

Many people believe they are serving Jesus, unaware that they have been misled. Recognizing these errors is crucial. When you realize you've strayed, repentance is essential to restore your relationship with God.

10. What about discrepancies in the Bible?

It is important to remember that altering the original manuscripts is considered sacrilegious. The original texts do not contain discrepancies. However, inaccuracies can arise during transcription or translation processes. Such inaccuracies may lead to misunderstandings and improper teachings. To prevent these issues, use the tools outlined at the beginning of this writing to carefully decipher words and uncover their true meanings. This will help ensure clarity and fidelity to the original intent.

CHAPTER 13

11. In the Bible, Judas, who betrayed Jesus, is described as dying in two different ways. Why is there a discrepancy? And is he going into the Lake of Fire for what he did?

Let's address your second question first. Judas repented of his sins and returned the money to the temple. It is not our place to judge his ultimate fate. Only God can make that determination. Leave the judging to Him.

Now, regarding the first part of your question about Judas' death seemingly being described in two different ways, I would argue there is no true discrepancy. Both accounts from different witnesses can be accurate. Allow me to illustrate this with an example.

Imagine you are walking down a path and see someone hanging from a tree. Naturally, you report that the person hung themselves. Now, consider a different scenario. Before you arrived, a group of individuals may have attacked the victim, placed a rope around their neck, and hung them. You, however, would only see the aftermath and report that the person hung themselves because you lacked knowledge of the prior events.

Extending the example further: after you passed by, the attackers could have returned, cut the victim open, and left the scene. Another eyewitness arriving later might see the body split open and report that detail. In this case, both witnesses describe what they observed, and both accounts are truthful, even though they focus on different aspects of the same event.

Similarly, the accounts of Judas' death can be understood as complementary perspectives from different witnesses rather than contradictory statements.

12. Can you shed some light on the fig tree? Did it die immediately when Jesus spoke to it, or the next day?

In the Book of Matthew, the fig tree appears to have withered immediately after Jesus spoke to it. In the Book of Mark, it is noted that the disciples observed the tree had withered the following day. However, it was Paul who confirmed that it had died instantly. While the timing may appear different from various perspectives, the focus should not be on the exact moment the tree died. Instead, the real question is: What is the meaning or the multiple lessons behind the Parable of the Fig Tree?

Jesus instructed us to "learn the parable of the fig tree." This begins in the Garden of Eden, where Adam and Eve used fig leaves to cover themselves, symbolizing deeper truths. Understanding the fig tree involves recognizing the distinction between the "good figs" and the "bad figs", or, in other terms, the difference between the wheat (God's children) and the tares (Satan's children). Another key meaning of the fig tree is understanding the season, as Jesus emphasized.

Jesus said, "But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day: For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be."

When Jesus spoke to the fig tree, it was not bearing fruit because it was out of season. The withering of the fig tree serves as a symbolic lesson: Do not be "harvested out of season." In other words, do not allow yourself to be deceived or taken by Satan prematurely. Instead, wait faithfully for the return of Jesus Christ.

This connects to the passage that says, "One shall be taken, and the other left behind." Contrary to common interpretation, being "taken" first refers to being deceived and taken by Satan. You want to remain steadfast, putting on the Gospel Armor of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Stand firm, resist Satan, and wait for Christ's return.

13. Did God forsake Jesus when He was on the cross?

Let's approach this with some common sense. No, God did not forsake Jesus. God would not forsake Himself. When Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" He was quoting Psalm 22. By doing this, Jesus pointed us to that Scripture, affirming His identity as the Messiah and fulfilling prophecy. Even in His final moments, Jesus continued to teach and guide us.

A related question is often asked. Why do the Gospels report different words spoken by Jesus on the cross? The answer lies in the perspectives of the witnesses. Each Gospel writer recorded what they personally saw and heard, providing complementary accounts that together offer a fuller picture of those profound moments.

14. Why do some Bible versions include Jesus' statement, "He who is without sin, cast the first stone," while others do not?

Over time, Biblical scholars have identified variations in ancient manuscripts. Some early copies of the Gospel of John omit this passage, while later versions include it. This discrepancy stems from differences in translation and manuscript discovery rather than a contradiction in Jesus' teachings. The account of Jesus and the adulterous woman is consistent with His message of grace and mercy, aligning with the overall narrative of the Gospels.

15. When we die, are we immediately with the Lord, or do we sleep until judgment?

Both statements hold truth, depending on the context. Scripture teaches that we possess two bodies: an earthly body (terrestrial) and a spiritual body (celestial). When our earthly body dies, it is described as "sleeping" and returns to dust. This is not a literal sleep but a metaphor for physical death.

However, the spirit immediately departs to a place of paradise, awaiting final judgment. Paradise is described as having two sides, separated by a gulf. Those who have repented and believed in Jesus Christ reside on the right side, while others remain on the left, awaiting the teachings in the millennium and then Judgment Day.

On Judgment Day, our spiritual bodies are judged. Some will receive eternal rewards, while others face separation from God. Understanding this dual reality helps reconcile the Scriptures that describe both immediate presence with the Lord and future judgment.

16. What is the difference between your spirit and your soul?

Simply put, your soul is your essence, while your spirit is the intellect or consciousness of the soul.

This distinction can be difficult to grasp, especially when considering how we transition between different states: from a spiritual body in the First Earth Age, to a human body in this Earth Age, and then back to a spiritual body in the final Heaven and Earth Age.

Let's use the hermit crab to illustrate this concept. A hermit crab must find a shell, or host, to inhabit, or it cannot survive. It might live in shells from sea snails, bivalves, scaphopods, or even hollow wood and stones. Yet, no matter which shell it occupies, it remains the same hermit crab.

Similarly, your soul and spirit remain the same regardless of the "host" they occupy, whether that host is a spiritual body, a flesh body, or something else.

Here's another example. When you step into a car, the car becomes a host to your body. It transports you to places, but if mishandled, it could harm or even kill you. If you board a plane, the plane becomes the host to your body for the journey.

Can the body itself host other entities? Absolutely. It can harbor viruses, bacteria, infections, and more. On a deeper level, depending on the faith of the soul and spirit, the body can also host either malevolent entities, like evil spirits, or benevolent ones, such as the Holy Spirit.

This is where people often misunderstand spiritual bodies, thinking they're merely insubstantial, like air. However, spiritual bodies have mass. How do we know? According to the Bible, fallen angels, including Satan, were capable of impregnating human women, which clearly implies they possessed physical mass.

To help broaden your perspective, consider this. A spiritual body could be likened to the most advanced computer or robot imaginable. Its "skin" might look and feel like flesh, but it's crafted with extraordinary precision. Its "brain" would have perfect functionality, with 100% recall. If a part becomes defective, it could theoretically be replaced, much like components in a computer. Does this analogy sound strange? Perhaps. But the point is to illustrate that a spiritual body isn't just empty space; it's something tangible, though we don't fully comprehend its nature.

17. Where Do the United States and Russia Fit in the Bible?

Many people often ask how the United States and Russia relate to the Bible and where various peoples originate. A thorough study of the Bible is necessary to understand the origins of the many families and nations. Here are a few key groups and their connections.

Hagar was Abraham's concubine and the mother of his son Ishmael. Hagar, an Egyptian servant to Abraham's wife Sarah, bore Ishmael at Sarah's request. Ishmael had twelve sons, who became the ancestors of the Arab nations we know today.

Abraham and Sarah later had a son, Isaac, who fathered two sons: Jacob and Esau. Esau's descendants, through the Hebrew tongue, became known as Rosh, which later evolved into Roush and, ultimately, modern-day Russia.

In approximately 721 BC, the Assyrian army captured the ten northern tribes of Israel. These tribes were exiled and scattered across the Assyrian Empire. Many of them crossed the Caucasus Mountains (from which the term Caucasians originates) and migrated into Europe, Canada, and the United States.

Zedekiah was the last king of Judah before the Babylonian invasion by King Nebuchadnezzar II in 587 BC. God had instructed Zedekiah to accept Babylonian captivity for seventy years, promising protection and prosperity during this time. Zedekiah initially agreed, forming a covenant with God. However, due to pride, Zedekiah broke this covenant, seeking to rebel against Nebuchadnezzar by hiring warriors from Egypt.

Breaking a covenant with God has serious consequences. When Zedekiah turned his back on God, he lost divine protection. Nebuchadnezzar discovered Zedekiah's rebellion, captured him, killed his ten sons in his presence, gouged out his eyes, and imprisoned him in Babylon, where he eventually died.

Some scholars claim this marked the end of Israel, but they overlook Zedekiah's daughters. The prophet Jeremiah took these daughters to safety in Egypt. From there, they traveled to Spain, Gibraltar, Cornwall, and ultimately Ireland. One daughter, Tea-Tephi, became Queen of Ireland, while the other, Tamar-Tephi, became part of the British monarchy. Through her lineage came King James, who commissioned the 1611 King James Bible.

Jacob, who was renamed Israel, had many sons, each fathering distinct tribes:

- Levi: From Levi came the priestly line. All Levitical priests descend from this tribe, though not all Levites were priests.
- Judah: The Jewish people trace their lineage to Judah. All Jews are Israelites, but not all Israelites are Jews.
- Joseph: Joseph's son Ephraim's descendants migrated to Great Britain, while his son Manasseh's descendants eventually migrated to the United States.

Understanding these ancestral connections offers a deeper perspective on the Biblical origins of nations and their roles in history.

18. What is the difference between a Disciple and an Apostle, and between Pharisees and Sadducees?

- **Disciple:** The term "disciple" comes from the same root as "discipline" and refers to someone in training. Disciples are learners who follow a teacher.
 - **Apostle:** Apostles are those who have completed their training and are sent out to teach and share what they have learned.
 - **Pharisees:** The Pharisees believed in life after death but did not recognize Jesus as the Messiah.
 - **Sadducees:** The Sadducees did not believe in life after death and also did not accept Jesus as the Messiah.

19. I have friends and loved ones who are gay. How can I help them change their ways?

It is unfortunate when people feel compelled to change others to fit their own perspectives. Instead, a Christian should focus inward, striving to be a positive example for others to follow. Beyond that, it is enough to plant seeds of love and understanding.

Let's consider the facts. There is nothing wrong with one person loving another, regardless of gender. There is nothing inherently wrong with two people of the same gender living together. However, the Bible addresses the sexual act itself, describing it in several passages, (seven in the Old Testament and six in the New Testament) as unnatural and an abomination to God. These Scriptures express this viewpoint through examples, idioms, and analogies.

It is important to remember that anything unnatural, according to Scripture, glorifies Satan. Should we attempt to change others? No. Let them exercise their God-given free will to make their own decisions.

If, during their journey, they come to realize that their actions glorify Satan, they may choose to change. But ultimately, the decision is theirs.

Let us also reflect on Scripture. In the end times, it will be like the days of Sodom and Gomorrah, marked by moral decline. The prophecy speaks of marriages to fallen angels, with part of this prophecy already fulfilled and the rest yet to come. Recognizing that prophecy cannot be changed, we should accept people for who they are.

Instead of trying to change others, love them unconditionally, lead by example, and plant seeds of truth. After that, move forward, trusting God's plan for everyone.

20. How Do I Plant Seeds?

Planting seeds can be as simple as performing an act of kindness. Offer a smile, uplift someone who is feeling down, or assist the elderly. Every kind gesture reflects God's love.

At the start of this writing, I discussed what to look for in a church. If you are part of a church that aligns with those principles, consider supporting their ministry through tithing.

The most effective way to plant a seed about the Bible is by asking a simple question and then stepping back. If someone is interested, they will ask for more information.

For instance, I began this piece by posing questions. If you continued reading, it means you were curious and wanted to learn more. This is the essence of planting a seed, sparking interest without overwhelming others. For those with deep Bible knowledge, the challenge often lies in sharing just enough and knowing when to stop. I have personally struggled with this. The desire to share everything can lead to overloading the listener.

Use discernment. Ask a question and allow the other person to guide the conversation according to their curiosity. If they are not interested in hearing more, respect their space. They may not be ready yet.

By maintaining your credibility and demonstrating patience, people may return to you with questions when the time is right.

CHAPTER 14

21. Does the Bible Say God Created Evil?

The passage you're referring to is a mistranslation. The correct interpretation of the word in question is adversity or turmoil. God permits adversity or turmoil for those who need correction and guidance back to righteousness.

To understand this, we must define evil. Sin is the violation of divine law, and committing sin is an act of evil. Humanity is fully capable of choosing evil without external influence. God created all things good; it is through human actions that evil arises. The origin of evil can be traced to Satan, whose disobedience marked the first act of rebellion.

Evil is not something God creates; rather, it is the result of choices and actions.

22. Why Does God Allow Satan to Live?

God had the option to destroy Satan but chose not to, as doing so would have also meant destroying a third of His children. Satan plays a pivotal role in God's plan by serving as the catalyst for testing. Everyone must be tested to determine their commitment to God. This process ensures that the rebellion led by Satan will never be repeated. Only those who align with God's will and meet His standard will remain, making His Kingdom secure for eternity.

23. Could Someone Else Do What Satan Did After the Third Earth Age Begins?

No. The rigorous testing humanity undergoes ensures that evil will be entirely eradicated after the millennium and judgment day. This is why there is no "free ride" or rapture. What do I mean?

The rapture concept suggests that belief alone is enough to escape testing and trials, negating the need for studying the Bible, especially the Book of Revelation. But how can someone be prepared without being tested? Without proper testing, the risk of rebellion could come up again, with someone else potentially stepping into Satan's role.

Testing proves a person's worth and solidifies their commitment. This is also why Satan is released briefly at the end of the millennium, to serve as the final test before evil is cast into the Lake of Fire.

Have you been tested? Let's explore three challenging situations that test faith, yet hold profound spiritual lessons.

However, with the knowledge of your condition, you are given the opportunity to ensure that your sins are blotted out of the Book of Life. On judgment day, only those sins left unrepented will remain for review.

This process of testing, whether through loss, illness, or trials, is part of God's divine plan to refine and prepare us for eternity with Him. Have faith, and trust in His wisdom and love.

24. Why Does God Allow Children to Suffer?

This question deeply troubles me. However, it is not God who allows children to suffer, the responsibility lies with us. Humanity has created pollution, diseases, and infections. If your child gets hurt and needs to come inside, the friend may cry because your child has left. However, your child is simply home, safe with you.

The Bible says it is good to drink a little wine for the sake of the stomach (1 Timothy 5:23). However, it does not condone drinking excessively or getting drunk. Drinking in moderation is not a sin, but overindulgence is. Once again, use common sense and practice self-control.

CHAPTER 16

41. What does the Bible say about sex before marriage?

In Biblical times, when a man spread his garment over a woman, it signified marriage in God's eyes. In modern terms, this means that sexual relations symbolize a profound union. From God's perspective, sex signifies a covenant similar to marriage.

If people understood that intimacy implies a serious, lifelong commitment, they might think more carefully about their choices. If a member of the church, symbolized as an "eye" (a visionary) or a "hand" (a worker), goes astray or becomes a harmful influence, the Scripture advises their removal to protect the congregation. This is the meaning of "if your eye offends thee, cut it out." It emphasizes the importance of safeguarding the church and its mission by addressing detrimental behavior decisively.

When encountering challenging or seemingly harsh passages in the Bible, it is essential to seek proper interpretation. The fault often lies not in the Scripture but in its misunderstanding.

45. What does it mean when the Bible says you can pick up snakes or drink poison and they will not harm you?

The reality is straightforward. If you pick up a rattlesnake by the tail, it will bite you, and without immediate medical attention, the consequences could be fatal. This Scripture is often misunderstood when taken literally. Its true meaning is spiritual, not physical. It signifies that if you remain steadfast in your faith, no matter the malicious or harmful words spoken against you, you will be protected by the Gospel Armor and the power of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As discussed in question #34, wearing the Gospel Armor provides wisdom and protection, ensuring that Satan's poisonous darts, whether lies, temptations, or attacks, cannot harm you. However, this does not mean you should physically drink poison or handle snakes. In other words, do not put the Lord your God to the test.

Use discernment when interpreting Scripture. Not everything is meant to be taken literally. Applying wisdom is key to understanding the Bible correctly.

46. A friend told me that because of the New Testament, you can eat whatever you want, provided you ask for God's blessings. Is that true?

First and foremost, eating improperly is not a sin that will condemn your soul to the Lake of Fire. However, it is a sin against your body, which can lead to sickness and poor health. Jesus said, "I come not to change the law, but to fulfill it," which implies that the food laws from Leviticus remain significant.

Misinterpretations of Scripture often cause confusion. Consider this: have human bodies changed fundamentally since creation? No. The foods that affected people negatively in ancient times still affect us similarly today.

Here's an example from Scripture where God taught Peter a lesson using unclean food. God presented Peter with a vision of a sheet containing unclean animals and commanded him three times to eat. Each time, Peter refused. This vision was not about food, but served as an analogy. God was teaching Peter a lesson. He was talking about Cornelius the Centurion and his people, who were outside Peter's door. Peter was not to call them unclean or unworthy if they believed in Christ. God's message to Peter was about accepting all believers, not changing dietary laws.

Then some people misquote the Book of Timothy, claiming that all foods are created to be eaten with thanksgiving. However, the key phrase in Scripture is "created to be received." God did not create all foods to be consumed. While everything God makes is good, not everything is suitable for consumption. For instance, many rely on their doctor's approval for eating certain foods, such as bacon. To them, I ask: will you follow your doctor or God?

Take the pig, as an example. Pigs lack sweat glands on their bodies, so toxins from what they eat remain in their flesh. When you consume pork, those toxins can transfer to you, affecting your health.

If someone continually eats improperly and ends up sick, they cannot blame God or Satan for their condition. Poor health is often the result of poor dietary choices. At the same time, just because the Bible lists certain foods as clean does not mean everyone should eat them. For instance, while the Bible states that beef is clean, if your body cannot tolerate animal protein, you should avoid it.

In summary, use common sense, moderation, and personal discernment regarding food laws. Listen to your body and seek balance in honoring both Scripture and your health.

47. How Do I Repent?

Repentance can be as simple as offering this heartfelt prayer:

"Father, forgive me for all of my sins. Cleanse my spirit and soul. Help me to grow and serve Your will. I ask this in Jesus' precious name. Amen."

If it is a sin that you have repented for but it keeps coming up in your mind, the first step is to thank our heavenly Father for forgiving you for that sin. Once God forgives a sin, He doesn't want to hear about it again. If it does come up again, simply thank our heavenly Father for already forgiving you.

The next step is to distract your mind. To do this, say the words "don't look back" repeatedly. At the same time, picture a brick wall in your mind and focus on it. By concentrating on the wall and saying "don't look back" over and over, your mind gets distracted, and your thoughts will drift to something else. This technique is also very effective for overcoming pain.

With practice, you'll gain the ability to have more peace and happiness in your life.

50. Why do you say... "If God willing, may you have a blessed day"? When isn't God willing?

It is written... "Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son. If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed".

In other words, you should only give God speed to those who follow the word of God. To put it another way, there are conditions that must be met before God will bless. God is not always willing. In other words, let it be God's will whether they have a blessed day or not.

If I unknowingly run across an atheist and I say... "If God willing, may you have a blessed day", and they say I'm an atheist, I just say, "I'm sorry to hear that, then maybe God is not willing", and I let the conversation end.

Notice how I did not say "God bless you", as so many people say to others in their everyday conversations. If I did, I would be offering God's blessings to an unbeliever. Only offer God's blessings, if it is God's will. If in every day, in every way, you lived your life by God's will, you would live a much happier life.

What I'm about to share could be one of the biggest game changers in improving your daily life. It has the potential to transform the decisions you make, how you act, how you respond to others, and how you treat them.

Every day, in every situation, your actions ultimately boil down to one of two things: you either glorify God or glorify Satan. Period.

Before anyone argues with their spouse, yells at their children, or mistreats a pet, they should pause and think: By my actions, am I glorifying God or Satan? God blessed each of us with the ability to think and reason, we should use it wisely.

Consider this: if someone reads the words of this book and dismisses them without thought or research, who are they glorifying by that quick judgment?

Take another example. For veterans who have shed blood in battle to defend our country, know that this act of service can glorify God, as seen in Psalm 144, the soldier's prayer. On the other hand, committing senseless violence, such as lying in wait to harm someone without cause, glorifies Satan.

Even in the simplest of disputes, whether about the position of the toilet paper roll, the toilet seat, or the toothpaste cap, ask yourself: Who am I glorifying through this argument?

Now, for more complex scenarios, like considering a significant life decision such as a gender change, the question remains: Who is being glorified by this choice, God or Satan? These are not matters to argue about but to reflect on deeply.

Many people argue endlessly over trivial matters, feeling compelled to be right at all costs. But when they do, who are they glorifying? Even in religious discussions, some individuals argue about Biblical teachings, believing they are doing God's work. Forcing beliefs on others does not glorify God. Planting seeds of faith and allowing others to make their own choices does glorify God.

Remember, God granted each of us free will, but that freedom comes with consequences. If someone chooses to glorify Satan, that is their decision, and their soul.

Here's the takeaway. If you strive every day to glorify God and align your actions with His will, you will experience a more joyful and fulfilling life. God wants to bless us, but we must take responsibility to earn those blessings.

CHAPTER 20

Could This Prediction Be True?

Earlier, I mentioned that the asteroid God formed approximately 4.6 billion years ago may have an influence on humanity's future. Modern scientists have named this 1,000-foot-wide (305 meters) asteroid "Apophis," after the Egyptian god of chaos and destruction.

Jesus said, "But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day: For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be."

Asteroid Apophis is predicted to pass close to Earth on Friday, April 13, 2029, and even closer in 2036. Some projections suggest the Euphrates River could dry up by 2036. If Apophis were to strike Earth during that time, it could align with prophecy about Satan's reign and great tribulation.

Am I claiming this will happen? Absolutely not. However, if we truly desire to be part of God's army, we must remain vigilant, aware of our surroundings, and attentive to signs. Always watch and seek understanding.
